DOCUMENTS AND INFORMATION REQUIRED FOR DEVELOPMENT AND BUILDING PERMITS FOR DETACHED ACCESSORY BUILDINGS (SHEDS, GAZEBOS AND GARAGES)

Required actions and information

Electronic documents may be sent to construction@dieppe.ca

- O Property owner's name, mailing address, telephone and fax numbers and email address.
- O Applicant's or contractor's name, mailing address, telephone and fax numbers and email address.

 (A land owner declaration form must also be filled out if the applicant is different from the property owner(s)).
- O Civic number and street name, or lot number and street name, or Property identification (PID) number(s).
- O Site plan showing the following:
 - · Lot dimensions, location of surrounding street(s), watercourses, easements, right-of-way's or other relevant encumbrances
 - Location of existing buildings or structures
 - · Projected location of proposed building(s) with distances from lot lines and adjacent buildings
- O Provide detailed construction plans or if less than 592 sq. ft. / 55 sq. m complete one of the following template(s) depending on foundation type:
 - · without concrete foundation or
 - · with concrete foundation
- O Signature and payment of the development and construction permit application.

Additional documents (if applicable)

- O Provide pre-engineered shop drawings and layouts for engineered roof trusses, floor joists, beams, lintels, helical piles, etc.
- O A concrete slab in excess of 592 sq. ft. / 55 sq. m or buildings with a 2nd storey (full or partial) must be designed with foundations going to frost level or must be designed by a professional registered engineer licensed to practise in the province of New Brunswick. The document is to bear a signed and dated seal of a professional registered engineer licensed to practise in the province of New Brunswick.
- O Where the building is proposed within 30 m (98 ft.) of a restricted body of water, an approval from the Department of Environment and Local Government (Clean Water Act) shall be submitted.

Additional documents may be required to complete the permit application.
