
ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON ACCESSIBILITY

CITY OF DIEPPE

(Current as of May 27, 2013.)

Mandate:

Encourage dialogue toward ensuring accessibility to municipal properties and facilities, programs and services, thereby contributing to the quality of life of Dieppe residents with a disability.

Responsibilities:

1. Inform city council regarding the situation surrounding accessibility to city properties and facilities, programs and services;
2. Suggest ways to sensitize the general public, elected officials, as well as city staff, agencies and commissions;
3. Create partnerships, meet with, and maintain good relationships with other organizations supporting the committee in the fulfilment of its mandate;
4. In collaboration with the management representative, analyze the concerns, problems and requests in regards to accessibility by people with a disability and offer paths or opinions toward solutions;
5. Identify programs, activities or initiatives which could improve accessibility at city properties and facilities;
6. Provide a voice to people with a disability who have difficulty accessing city properties and facilities, programs and services;
7. Exchange ideas with other advisory committees, as required;
8. Study and analyze issues as requested by city council.

Committee composition:

The Committee will be composed of a maximum of 12 people:

- 6 members representing the community, which includes 1 member representing the community as a seniors' representative
- 1 member representing the Canadian Council on Rehabilitation and Work
- 1 member representing Ability New Brunswick Inc. (ANB)
- 1 member representing the Greater Moncton Association for Community Living
- 1 member representing the Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB)
- 1 member representing city council
- 1 member representing staff (ex-officio)
