Frequently asked questions

How can I get tickets for the events?

Fricot Franco Festival activities are free. No tickets are required. Admission to all sites is first come, first served.

Can I bring a backpack or purse?

Yes, but all items are subject to inspection. Backpacks with frames are not permitted.

Can I leave the site and return later?

Yes. You may leave the site at any time and return later.

Are strollers permitted?

Yes.

What should I bring?

We recommend having the following on hand:

- Sunscreen
- Empty reusable water bottle
- Cap or sun hat
- Poncho in case of rain (check the weather forecast)

Can I bring a camera?

Yes, cameras are permitted. However, professional audio or video recording equipment is not permitted without media accreditation.

What should I do if I become separated from my child at the festival?

Notify a security guard or go to the City of Dieppe tent in the centre of the site.

Where is the lost and found?

Found items will be taken to the City of Dieppe tent in the centre of the site. You may also contact the UNIplex reception desk at 506.877.7989 starting Monday, August 17.

Is smoking or vaping permitted?

A designated area will be available on site for smoking and vaping. You may be removed from the site if you smoke or vape outside this area.

Where will the accessible parking be located?

For the August 14 show, accessible parking will be located at École Ste-Thérèse (500 Notre-Dame Street). For the main festivities on August 15, accessible parking will be located at the UNIplex (450 Collège Street).

Can I bring my service animal?

Yes. Service animals are permitted on site, but pets are not.

Can I bring food or beverages?

No outside food or beverages are permitted. However, you may bring an empty reusable water bottle to fill at the free water station. There will also be about 15 food and beverage vendors on site.

Frequently asked questions

Can I bring prescription medication?

Prescription medication is permitted, provided it is in its original container. Anyone bringing prescription medication must present photo identification bearing the same name as the prescription label. The pills in the bottle must also match the description on the label. Over-the-counter medications are permitted, provided they are unopened and in their original factory-sealed packaging.

Can my child accompany me into the area where alcohol is served?

No. Only adults aged 19 and over will be permitted in this area during the shows on August 14 and 15.

Is the comedy show suitable for children?

The comedy show on Thursday, August 13 is intended for mature audiences. The show is not recommended for young children.

Is capacity limited?

Yes. Some shows have a maximum capacity based on safety standards.

Can I bring a chair?

Yes. A limited number of chairs will be permitted in the designated area. However, chairs will not be permitted near the stage.

Where can I park?

On August 12 and 13, several free parking options are available at Place 1604. On August 14 and 15, the UNIplex parking lot will be closed to provide parking for production and logistics crews and performers. However, free parking is available at the following locations:

- CCNB
- Place 1604 parking lots
- UNI Financial Corporation parking lot (after 4 p.m.)

Will there be a first aid station?

Yes. A first aid station will be set up, and first aid personnel will circulate throughout the sites.

What forms of payment are accepted?

Cash, credit cards, and debit cards. Please note that some vendors accept cash only. ATMs will be available on site. Service fees will apply.

Where is Place 1604 located?

Place 1604 is located at 243, Gauvin Road, behind Dieppe City Hall. Several free parking options are available all around Place 1604.

Where is the MusiquART site located?

The MusiquART site is located at 475 Notre-Dame Street. It is the outdoor site adjacent to the UNIplex.

Traffic plan

Traffic changes are expected downtown during the festivities to ensure public safety.

- **Notre-Dame Street:** completely closed to traffic between Ste-Thérèse and Gould from August 14 to 16. Only pedestrians and emergency services will be allowed access.
- **Champlain Street:** one Moncton-bound lane will be closed between Collège and Notre-Dame to allow the Tintamarre parade to take place.
- **Ste-Thérèse Street:** closed to traffic due to construction, from Acadie to Richelieu.
- **Free parking at CCNB:** motorists must access the parking lot from Champlain Street (the Collège Street entrance will be closed until late evening).

Public Transit: On August 15 transit service on all Dieppe routes will be extended until 1 a.m. All service between **10 p.m. and 1 a.m. will be FREE!**
